

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A note from our CEO

IF I HAD TO SUM UP 2025 IN ONE WORD, IT WOULD BE *DEMAND*.


In 2025, Growth Energy influenced the policy landscape to create historic opportunities for biofuels, and we turned those opportunities into results.



The new Administration’s focus on rural America generated momentum for policies that strengthen American energy security, lower fuel costs, and drive growth in the farm economy.

Growth Energy acted early, articulating a clear federal policy roadmap that showed how year-round E15, strong volumes under the Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS), an extended 45Z credit, and balanced trade relationships all aligned with Congress’ and the newly elected president’s agenda.

By planning ahead, shaping the discourse, and cultivating policymaker champions, our transformative advocacy secured a series of major wins for farmers, producers, and consumers.

DRIVING SUCCESS IN THE BELTWAY AND BEYOND

Biofuels started winning on day one, when one of President Trump’s first Executive Orders directed the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to consider issuing emergency waivers for E15 to be sold in the summer months. The momentum built from there — a summer waiver arrived with minimal friction. Lawmakers reintroduced the Nationwide Consumer and Fuel Retailer Choice Act, and the bill — which would approve year-round E15 — racked up a record number of bipartisan cosponsors.

Growth Energy sustained a drumbeat of advocacy that included farmers, elected officials, and other stakeholders in support of this legislation. By combining targeted digital outreach, earned media, and grassroots activation, we ensured lawmakers started 2026 with a clear message: Rural America needs — and drivers around the country deserve — access to permanent, year-round E15 now. As a result of our efforts, bipartisan support is deeper, coalition coordination is broader, and public awareness is at an all-time high.

Growth Energy added a powerful tool to influence Capitol Hill. Members and industry stakeholders recorded short videos on what E15 means to them and their communities. These were sent directly to lawmakers in support of year-round E15.



Mobilization and the Importance of Partnerships

In 2025 Growth Energy maintained a steady drumbeat of advocacy communications from multiple different groups of stakeholders to policymakers at all levels. By the end of the year, these efforts had resulted in pro-biofuel letters from 16 Senators, seven governors, 16 state attorneys general, and thousands of individual corn growers across the Midwest.

From Capitol Hill to commuters’ phones, our E15 campaign met policymakers where they were — and drove action.

Building Momentum on E15

In 2025 Growth Energy:

- Led advocacy efforts that helped secure a day-one executive order promoting nationwide, year-round E15 access.
- Worked closely with the Administration to ensure a timely summer E15 waiver.
- Drove bipartisan momentum behind the reintroduction of the Nationwide Consumer and Fuel Retailer Choice Act.
- Developed and executed a multi-channel advocacy effort to showcase the benefits of year-round E15.
- Helped introduce E15 incentives in Indiana, Kansas, and Ohio.
- Championed **E15 approval in California** after years of persistent advocacy.





Extending and Enhancing the 45Z Clean Fuel Credit

In 2022, our industry celebrated passage of the 45Z Clean Fuel Production Credit as part of Democrats’ signature legislation. But with a new administration and new Congressional leadership at the helm, Growth Energy redoubled efforts to showcase how a longer timeline would spur billions in innovation and rural development.

In 2025 we:

- Pressed U.S. Treasury and IRS to finalize guidance for implementation of 45Z.
- Secured an extension of the 45Z Clean Fuel Credit to strengthen long-term market certainty.
- Advocated for clarity around farmers’ investments in sustainable practices.

Renewable Fuel Standard RVOs

Even as we opened new markets, Growth Energy fought to strengthen the bedrock of biofuel demand: the RFS. In June, after close communication with Growth Energy and our members, EPA proposed record-high Renewable Volume Obligations (RVOs) for 2026–2027.

Growth Energy led the charge to support these ambitious volumes — and to ensure that every mandated gallon made it to the market without the abuse of small refinery exemptions. Since the proposal, we have rallied our members and allies to submit comments and provide expert analysis to EPA to continue the push to finalize EPA’s proposal.

DEEP EXPERTISE

Leveraging key insights and providing strategic leadership to advance the industry.

Growth Energy's policy and technical teams shaped the discourse in 2025, putting unrivaled subject-matter expertise and strategic analysis to work for our members.

DEEP EXPERTISE

We submitted dozens of data-driven comment letters and conducted briefings with policymakers at EPA, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), the U.S. Department of the Treasury, and other agencies.

We testified on Capitol Hill; made persuasive arguments in court cases, and continued to broaden the reach of our thought leadership in Washington and beyond. These efforts were recognized and amplified in local, regional, and national press, as well as at conferences across the country and around the world. When lawmakers, decision-makers, reporters, or the public need research, data, or insight into the future of biofuels and agriculture, they turn to Growth Energy for its deep expertise.

By year's end, Growth Energy cemented our status as the go-to expert on renewable fuels — we delivered the knowledge policymakers need, defended the RFS in the courts, fought for fair competition for U.S. biofuels in global markets, kept members engaged, provided technical expertise, supplied clear, reliable data, and amplified our narrative on the world stage.

Journalists regularly cited our data and quotes in national media. Wherever bioeconomy strategy was discussed, our analysts set the agenda — reinforcing that this industry's knowledge center is Growth Energy. In every sense, our deep expertise paid off: smarter policy, bigger markets, and stronger returns for our members.

We continued to work with global standards organizations to ensure industry compatibility.







MARKET ADVANCEMENT

Driving adoption, boosting demand, and positioning biofuels for long-term success.

Whether at home in the U.S. or overseas, Growth Energy's commitment to expanding and opening new markets continued in 2025.



We strengthened strategic partnerships with fuel retailers and achieved record growth in biofuel availability across retail sites and terminals.

Each new station, retail partner, and terminal supplier translated directly into increased bioethanol sales. To date, Growth Energy has helped more than 4,700 retail sites add higher blends such as E15 and E85 — with 2025 marking a record year as more than 900 new sites came online.

In 2025, we also drove higher E15 volumes at existing locations through innovative marketing strategies, including the introduction of E15 premium, optimized pump configurations, retailer in-app promotions, and targeted paid campaigns that reached consumers where purchasing decisions are made.

Today, consumers can find E15 at more than 4,700 retail locations nationwide.

Securing markets for bioethanol products at home and abroad

Growth Energy's engagement abroad reached new heights in 2025. We aggressively engaged in international trade policy, including filing formal comments to the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative (USTR) and other bodies on critical issues, ranging from U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA) review to Section 301 investigation into Brazil's unfair trade practices.

In our comments to USTR on its USMCA review, we are seeking to ensure free and fair trade with Canada, our largest trading partner, and expand new access to Mexico for higher bioethanol blends. And in Brazil, we set the record straight on long-standing unfair practices from tariffs to meaningful participation in Brazil's biofuels policies to highlighting how unsustainable agriculture practices are hurting U.S. farmers in export markets. Voicing the concerns of American farmers in trade cases such as these helps push for a more level playing field in global fuel markets — one that will continue to pay dividends in 2026 and the years to come.

In 2025, Growth Energy:

- Enhanced U.S. ability to compete through free trade and regulations grounded in sound science.
- Rallied support for trade deals with the EU, Indonesia, Japan, the UK, and Vietnam that would open new markets for American biofuels.
- Regularly interfaced with USTR and USDA Foreign Service Officers to ensure bioethanol remains top of mind in advocacy.
- Testified at USTR's hearing on Brazil's Section 301 investigation calling for swift action against Brazil's unfair trade practices.





